BOARD OF GOVERNORS SCHOLARSHIP

Valued at \$1,300, this scholarship is awarded to a student entering the 1st-year of a program in arts or science. The applicant must have obtained a minimum of 75% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses) or the equivalent and must not be in receipt of any other major award.



BOURSES FRANCO

The Bourses Franco, valued at \$1000 have been created to encourage first year students to register in a program offered in French. Students must register in 24 credits, (i.e. 80% of a full course load) in French.



CARL AND LYLE SANDERS SCHOLARSHIPS (2)

Donated by the late Mr. and Mrs. Carl J. Sanders, Toronto-based business people and philanthropists. Value: \$2,200 each, the scholarships are awarded to 1st-year students enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts program, with a minimum 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



CARL J. SANDERS SCHOLARSHIPS (2)

A gift from the late Carl J. Sanders, a Toronto-based businessman with varied interests who, over the years, donated generously to educational institutions and charitable organizations. Valued at \$1,200 each, the scholarships are awarded to 1st-year students enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts, Science or Commerce program, with a minimum 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



CONCOURS PROVINCIAL DE FRANÇAIS ENTRANCE PRIZES (2)

Covering tuition fees, the prizes are awarded to the top two contestants in the Concours provincial de français secondary school language contest, enrolled in the 1st-year of any program.



CONCOURS DE FRANÇAIS LANGUE SECONDE ENTRANCE PRIZES (2)

Covering tuition fees, the prizes are awarded to the top two contestants in the Concours de français - langue seconde secondary school language contest, enrolled in the 1st-year of any program.



DR. EDNA L. MOORE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

A gift from the friends and colleagues of the late Dr. Edna L. Moore, the first Public Health Nurse in the Ontario Ministry of Health. Having been previously active in a national organization for public health nursing in the United States, she received an honorary doctorate degree from the University of Western Ontario in 1957. Value: \$280. Recipient: the 1st-year student enrolled in the School of Nursing with the highest academic standing. The student may not be in receipt of any other major award. The faculty of the School of Nursing makes the selection.



EDITH ROSE BROOKS MEMORIAL AWARD

This award is given in memory of Miss Edith Brooks, through the Music Department, and will be awarded to a student in his/her first year of the music program with the highest overall standing in secondary school U/M courses. Value is variable.



FRANK S. RESSEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS (4)

Established in 1990 by the late Frank S. Ressel of Sudbury. Valued at \$1,000 each, the scholarships are awarded to 1st-year students enrolled in any undergraduate program on the basis of academic standing in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



HORACE J. FRASER SCHOLARSHIP

A gift from Mrs. Catherine Fraser in memory of her late husband, Horace J. Fraser, former President of Falconbridge Nickel Mines Ltd., esteemed member of the University's Board of Governors from 1960-1969 and Chair of the Board from 1965-1969. Valued at \$2,000, the scholarship is awarded to a full-time student entering the 1st-year of any program, with a minimum 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



DR. JUDITH WOODSWORTH PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP

Established by former President Judith Woodsworth, the purpose of this award is to recognize excellence among students at Laurentian University. The recipient will be chosen among the new recipients of a National Dean's Scholarship for Excellence each year. Value is \$1,000. Eligibility is limited to recipients of National Dean's Scholarships for Excellence. This award is renewable.



LAAA-ALUMNI ASSOCIATION ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

Valued at \$2,500, the scholarship is awarded to a full-time student entering the 1st-year of any program, with a minimum of 70% average in a secondary school. Student must not be in receipt of any other awards from Laurentian University.



LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY 35TH ANNIVERSARY SCHOLARSHIPS (4)

Valued at \$1,000 each, the scholarships are awarded to a 1st-year students enrolled in any undergraduate program, on the basis of academic standing (minimum 80%) in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Each newly admitted student who just graduated from full-time studies at a secondary school and meets the criteria to be an Ontario Scholar (on 6 best U/M courses) is guaranteed an entrance scholarship. The value of the scholarship is as follows:

- \$14,000 (\$3,500 x 4 years) with a grade average of 95-100%**
- \$10,000 (\$2,500 x 4 years) with a grade average of 90-94.9%**
- \$8,000 (\$2,000 x 4 years) with a grade average of 85-89.9%**
- \$4,500 (\$1,500 year 1, \$1,000 years 2, 3, 4) with a grade average of 80-84.9%**

To continue your scholarship at the same value, your average in subsequent years must remain within the same range as your admission average. If your average decreases, or increases in subsequent years, your award will be recalculated on the basis of the above scholarship grid.

Scholarship offers are extended on the basis of interim marks, and are renewable for a maximum of three additional years with the value in subsequent years based on the above grid. MCINTOSH ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP FUND & STANTEC – MINING SCHOLARSHIP FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

These scholarships seek to award premiere students early in their years of study in the mining and mechanical engineering programs at Laurentian University. There are 44 awards in total valued at \$2800, to be disbursed over five years. First and second year students enrolled on a full-time basis are eligible.



MR. AND MRS. MYER LEVINE SCHOLARSHIP

Established by their children, to honour Mr. and Mrs. Levine, this scholarship has a \$1,000 value.



Mr. Levine (1889-1973) was a local businessman and founder of Levine's Ladies Wear in Sudbury. The scholarship is awarded to a student entering the 1st year at University College. The applicant must have obtained a minimum 75% average in a secondary school in Sudbury (in six U/M course) or the equivalent, demonstrate financial need, and not be in receipt of another major award.



ONTARIO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS FOUNDATION FOR EDUCATION ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS (2)

Two scholarships, each valued at \$1,000, are awarded annually to outstanding students entering first-year Engineering at Laurentian University. Where possible, the scholarships are awarded to a female student and to a male student with the highest academic standing in an Ontario secondary school (six U/M courses). The scholarships are awarded on the recommendation of the School of Engineering.



PETER BAROTT SCHOLARSHIP

A gift from the friends, colleagues and associates of the late Peter Barott, a Montreal-based architect who designed major projects including the Science I Building at the University and who contributed to an Expo 67 project in collaboration with another architectural firm. Valued at \$1,000, the scholarship is awarded to a 1st-year student enrolled in the Engineering program, with a min. 75% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses) and not in receipt of other scholarships or bursaries that exceed a total value of \$1,500. If no student entering Engineering is eligible, the award may be given to a student entering a science program.



R.J. ASKIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by Abitibi-Price Inc. (Toronto), in memory of the late Robert J. Askin, a former Governor of the University and a member of the Board from its inception until his death in 1961. Mr. Askin demonstrated a keen interest in the affairs of the University and contributed greatly to engineering. Valued at \$700, the award is presented to a 1st-year student enrolled in any program, on the basis of academic excellence in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).



THAYER LINDSLEY SCHOLARSHIP

A bequest of the late Thayer Lindsley (1882-1976), founder and former President of Falconbridge Nickel Mines Ltd. When he retired in 1956, Mr. Lindsley established the John Lindsley Trust which provides the funds for this award. Valued at \$2,500, the scholarship is awarded to a student entering a Bachelor of Science or Engineering program with a min. 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (on six U/M courses).



THOMAS D. EDWARD SCHOLARSHIP

Donated by Edwards Sudbury Ltd. in memory of the late Thomas D. Edward (1894-1971), its founder and former president who had a keen sense of business and was actively involved in numerous local service clubs. Valued at \$1,000, the scholarship is awarded to a 1st-year student enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts, Science or Commerce, with a min. 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).




WALTER LIGHT ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS (1)


Valued at \$1,000, the award is presented to a 1st-year student enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts (Humanities) or Bachelor of Commerce, with a minimum 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses).


SECTION II - An application is required for any of the following awards. Please refer to the specifics outlined for each award and ensure the appropriate sections of the application form (located at the back) are complete.

-  **ANNE CRICHTON-GEORGE SCHOLARSHIPS**
  The Anne Crichton-George Scholarships were established in 1998, in memory of Anne Crichton-George and her active involvement in Chapleau, Ontario. These scholarships valued at \$2,500 each, will be awarded to full-time 1st-year students from Chapleau, Ontario enrolled in any program (if there is no qualified applicant from Chapleau the award may be given to a student from northeastern Ontario). They must have achieved a min. average of 80% in an Ontario Secondary School (6 best 4U/M courses), have demonstrated a broad range of interests and community involvement, as well as financial need. Renewable in subsequent years with acceptable academic standing. Students may receive this award in addition to other university financial aid.
- ASSOCIATION DES ÉTUDIANTES ET ÉTUDIANTS FRANCOPHONES SCHOLARSHIP**
  Valued at \$500, the bursary is awarded to a full time 1st-year student who is studying in a French program. Award recipient must have achieved a minimum average of 75% in an Ontario Secondary School (6 4U/M courses) or a GPA of 3.0 or greater at the postsecondary level. As well, the candidate must have made a significant contribution to the school frequented or community. Candidates are asked to submit a personal data sheet outlining their school or community involvement.
-  **CHRISTOPHER AND EVA DOHERTY BURSARY**
 This award was established by their children to honor Dr. and Mrs. C.J. Doherty. Dr. Doherty served on the Laurentian University Board of Governors from 1960 to 1968 and was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of law by the University in 1985. The bursary is awarded to a student entering the first year of full time study with at least a "B" average to continue receiving the award in subsequent years of study. Preference will be given to Northern Ontario students who are studying in a discipline in the health sciences, and can demonstrate financial need. Value is variable (up to tuition).
- CONSORTIUM NATIONAL DE FORMATION EN SANTÉ SCHOLARSHIP**
  Valued at \$1,000 this scholarship is awarded to a student entering full-time studies in one of the programs supported by the Consortium National de Formation en Santé (CNFS). Candidates must have a general average of 75% or more, and must have a proven track record of contributing to the franco-ontarian community. Candidates are asked to submit a personal data sheet outlining their community involvement. A distinct application is required. For information on applicable CNFS programs and to download the scholarship-specific application form, please refer to our website at www.sante.laurentienne.ca/boursesduCNFS.
-  **DOUGLAS WILLIAMSON BURSARY**
 This \$600 bursary is awarded to a student in the first year of the Geology program on the basis of financial need and academic standing.
-  **DOWLING HORSESHOE CLUB BURSARY**
A \$1,650 bursary is awarded annually to a student entering first-year full-time studies at Laurentian University. The bursary is awarded to a student from the Sudbury area (with preference being given to a resident of Dowling) who has demonstrated financial need.
-  **DR. FRANK J. CLUMPUS BURSARY FUND**
 This \$245 bursary is awarded to a full-time first-year student from northern Ontario, who has been an active volunteer and can demonstrate financial need.

-  **ENTRANCE BURSARIES FOR FINANCIAL NEED**
Bursaries are non-repayable awards offered to students who demonstrate financial need. These awards are valued at \$1,000 each. Eligibility is based on financial need.
-   **GERALD (KSTJ) AND MARGUERITE LOUGHEED SCHOLARSHIP**
The Lougheed family has long been recognized throughout the region for its philanthropic accomplishments and commitment to caring for others. In this spirit and to honour Gerry Lougheed Senior's Knighthood in the Order of St. John by Governor General Ray Hnatyshyn on October 26th, 1990, his family offers annually a scholarship valued at \$1,200.
To qualify, a student must be a resident of the City of Greater Sudbury who attains a minimum average of 80% in the appropriate secondary school courses required for admission to Laurentian University. An application is required and the student must also be recommended by the head of the Department of English or French of their secondary school as a student who has demonstrated excellent literacy skills. Candidates are asked to submit a personal data sheet outlining their community involvement.
-   **INDIA-CANADA ASSOCIATION OF SUDBURY SCHOLARSHIP**
Valued at \$500, the scholarship is awarded annually to a first-year student enrolled full-time in any program at Laurentian University. The student must have achieved a minimum of 80% in his/her 6 best 4U/M courses, or the equivalent, and must demonstrate that she/he has made a significant contribution to the community. Preference is given to dependents of members of the India-Canada Association of Sudbury, or of any other East Indian cultural and heritage organization maintaining similar objectives. Candidates must also be recommended by a secondary school guidance counsellor.
-    **JACQUELINE LABELLE AWARD**
This award valued at \$1,600 is presented to a full-time student entering the first year of any program, on the basis of academic excellence, financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Candidates must be graduates of École secondaire Horizon. Selection is made on the recommendation of the secondary school. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.
-   **JIM FIELDING MEMORIAL BURSARY**
Valued at a maximum of \$60,000 (\$15,000/year, renewable for 3 years; equivalent to the cost of tuition, cost of residence – if applicable – meal plan and cost of books and equipment), this bursary was created to provide students with an opportunity to attend university and realize their fullest potential. It is awarded to students who may have struggled academically because of financial and personal challenges that limit their ability to concentrate on their studies. This award is renewable for three subsequent years. To be eligible, applicants must be registered as full-time students and must demonstrate a financial need. In addition, they must be nominated by a teacher, guidance counselor, or professional speaking on their potential and background. Preference will be given to students pursuing applied studies. Recipients cannot be eligible to hold any other awards with a value of \$1,000 or more. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.
-   **JOHN F. MELLANEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**
This award was established by Eldon Mellaney to aid a student with financial need at Laurentian University. The recipient must be enrolled in their first year of the Computer Science program and must have a minimum academic standing of 80% average in their final year of high school. If there is no qualified recipient, this award will be offered to a student in the Mathematics program.
-  **LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY FACULTY ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP**
Donated by the Laurentian University Faculty Association, the scholarship, valued at \$1000 annually, is awarded to the son or daughter of a member of the CAW Mine-Mill and Smelter Workers Union, Local 598, entering the first year of any program at Laurentian University with the highest overall average. The candidate must be recommended by a secondary school guidance counsellor.



 **LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY FEDERATION MEMORIAL AWARD**
 Laurentian and its federated institutions created the Laurentian University Federation Memorial Award to to recognize the sacrifices of our soldiers and their families, of those who give their lives doing what we as a nation have asked of them. The award will provide full-time Laurentian students tuition for up to four years of study, and free on-campus housing in Sudbury for the first year. To be eligible, a student must be under the age of 26, a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, dependant of a Canadian Forces member killed while deployed on combat or peace support operations, and registered as a full-time undergraduate at Laurentian University in Sudbury or one of its federated universities. To apply, candidates should contact the Student Awards Office.



 **LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY FRENCH IMMERSION SCHOLARSHIPS**
 A number of \$500 scholarships are available to graduates of high school immersion programs. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic standing in French Immersion programs in an Ontario secondary school. The applicant must take at least 3 credits in the French language.



 **LUAA – ALUMNI FACULTY ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**
 Valued at \$500, the scholarship is awarded annually to one student in each of the faculties; Science and Engineering, Arts (Humanities or Social Sciences), Professional Schools and Management. The award is presented to a student who has a minimum academic standing of 80% in his/her 6 best 4U/M courses and has demonstrated financial need. To qualify, the candidate must fill out an application form.



LEADERSHIP AWARDS
  The Leadership Awards Program acknowledges and encourages the outstanding school and community leadership contribution of students. Each Ontario secondary school may nominate one student for the \$1,000 award. Schools are encouraged to follow the procedures established by their school awards committee. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the award-specific application form.



 **MICHELLE (JANE) RICHER MEMORIAL BURSARY**
 This \$300 bursary is awarded to a full-time student enrolled in the Honours B.Sc. in Kinesiology program. Selection is based on financial need and demonstration of leadership qualities.

NATIONAL DEAN’S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN ARTS – HUMANITIES
  This scholarship, valued at \$22,000, will be awarded annually to a full-time, first year student in the Arts – Humanities faculty. \$5,500/year, renewable for 3 years based on specific award criteria, the award includes mentorship with the Dean of the Faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the Dean, guarantee of a single room in residence and a study carrel in the Library. To be eligible, student must present a minimum of 90% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program, have made a significant contribution to his or her school and community, and have demonstrated leadership qualities. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.


NATIONAL DEAN’S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN ARTS – SOCIAL SCIENCES
  This scholarship, valued at \$22,000, will be awarded annually to a full-time, first year student in the Arts – Social Sciences faculty. \$5,500/year, renewable for 3 years based on specific award criteria, the award includes mentorship with the Dean of the Faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the Dean, guarantee of a single room in residence and a study carrel in the Library. To be eligible, student must present a minimum of 90% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program, have made a significant contribution to his or her school and community, and have demonstrated leadership qualities. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.



  **NATIONAL DEAN'S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN PROFESSIONAL SCHOOLS**
This scholarship, valued at \$22,000, will be awarded annually to a full-time, first year student in Professional Schools. \$5,500/year, renewable for 3 years based on specific award criteria, the award includes mentorship with the Dean of the Faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the Dean, guarantee of a single room in residence and a study carrel in the Library. To be eligible, student must present a minimum of 90% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program, have made a significant contribution to his or her school and community, and have demonstrated leadership qualities. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.

  **NATIONAL DEAN'S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN SCIENCES AND ENGINEERING**
This scholarship, valued at \$22,000, will be awarded annually to a full-time, first year student in Sciences and Engineering. \$5,500/year, renewable for 3 years based on specific award criteria, the award includes mentorship with the Dean of the Faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the Dean, guarantee of a single room in residence and a study carrel in the Library. To be eligible, student must present a minimum of 90% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program, have made a significant contribution to his or her school and community, and have demonstrated leadership qualities. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship-specific application form.

  **NATIONAL DEAN'S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN MANAGEMENT**
This scholarship, valued at \$22,000, will be awarded annually to a full-time, first year student in Management. \$5,500/year, renewable for 3 years based on specific award criteria, the award includes mentorship with the Dean of the Faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the Dean, guarantee of a single room in residence and a study carrel in the Library. To be eligible, student must present a minimum of 90% on 6 best 4 U/M courses or equivalent, including required courses for his or her program, have made a significant contribution to his or her school and community, and have demonstrated leadership qualities. A distinct application is required. Please refer to our website at www.laurentian.ca/entranceawards to download the scholarship specific application form.

 **NICK VOLF ENGINEERING BURSARY**
This \$580 bursary is awarded to a full-time first-year Engineering student on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency, as defined by OSAP.

 **PADA MEMORIAL AWARDS**
Established by the Pada family, friends and associates, in memory of a fine gentleman and noted CVRD-Inco geologist, Vishnu Pada. He and his two daughters, Brinda and Arti, died tragically in the crash of Air India flight 182 in 1985. The bursary will be awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need, and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP; the recipient must be a graduate student from Marymount Academy Secondary School. If no qualified applicant is chosen from Marymount Academy Secondary School, the bursary will be awarded to a full-time Geology Student at Laurentian University. Value is \$800.

  **RICHARD POUND SPAD BURSARY**
Established by alumni, family and friends in attendance at the SPAD 35th Reunion celebration in 2007, the Richard Pound SPAD Bursary will be awarded to a student enrolled in the 1st year of the Honours Bachelor of Commerce in Sports Administration. Selection of the recipient is based on academic excellence (minimum 80%) in an Ontario secondary school (6 best U/M courses). The bursary will be awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need, and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP. Value is \$780.



SID FORSTER MEMORIAL AWARD

The Sid Forster Memorial Award was established by family and friends of the late Sidney Clair "Sid" Forster as a tribute to his dedication and commitment to his family and community. Valued at 5% of the endowment (\$835), the scholarship is awarded to a student entering the first year of any undergraduate program. The award is presented to a student who 1) has demonstrated the greatest improvement in academic standing in secondary school studies, 2) has made a contribution to her/his school or community, and 3) has demonstrated financial need. To qualify, the candidate must be a resident of the City of Greater Sudbury and be recommended by a secondary school guidance counsellor.



SUDBURY CANADA-WIDE SCIENCE FAIR SCHOLARSHIP

This \$450 scholarship is awarded annually to a full-time student entering first-year studies in an undergraduate program in the Faculty of Science and Engineering. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of the scholastic achievement of the candidate. Preference is given to applicants who have previously participated in a science fair. Candidates must also be recommended by a secondary school guidance counsellor.



THOMAS BALFE MEMORIAL AWARD

This \$330 award is awarded to a student in the first year of the Honours Bachelor of Commerce program who has demonstrated financial need.
