Legislative Requirements



One of our missions at the Occupational Health and Safety Office is to enable you to work in a healthy and safe environment. To help us achieve this goal, you

may be required to take some of the training courses we have listed below. This list is not a complete list of health and safety training needs. Some areas require job specific training which will be provided by the respective departments. Please contact your supervisor to discuss your training needs.

All employees are required to attend training sessions which include:

General Safety Orientation: Focus on basic safety concerns and procedures to call for assistance in case of an emergency.

WHMIS General Training: Required for all employees who work near or with controlled substances.

Workplace Violence Prevention Training:

Designed to present the University's policy and to ensure that all employees are instructed on procedures to call for immediate assistance.

NOTE: These courses are offered in class as well as on-line.
