

ENGINEERING AWARDS

ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

McIntosh Engineering Scholarship Fund and Stantec Mining Scholarship

Established in 2009. These Scholarships seek to award premiere students early in their years of study in the mining engineering program at Laurentian University. There are 14 awards in total, to be disbursed over five years. First and second year students enrolled on a full-time basis are eligible.

Value: \$2,800

Application required.

The National Dean's Scholarship for Excellence

Awarded to a student entering a Science or Engineering program having achieved a minimum of 90% on her/his best six U/M courses. The student must have demonstrated leadership qualities, and must have made a significant contribution to her/his school and community. To maintain this scholarship in subsequent years of the undergraduate program, the awardee will be required to maintain an 80% average or better.

Value: \$22,000 each (\$5,500 renewable for four years)

Each scholarship also includes a mentorship with the Dean of the faculty or a distinguished faculty member selected by the dean, a guarantee of a single room in residence, and a study carrel in the Library. **Dean's National Scholarship for Excellence application required.**

The Thayer Lindsley Scholarship

A bequest of the late Thayer Lindsley (1882-1976), founder and former President of Falconbridge Nickel Mines Ltd. When he retired in 1956, Mr. Lindsley established the John Lindsley Trust which provides the funds for this award.

Recipient: a student entering a Bachelor of Science or Engineering program with a min. 80% average in an Ontario secondary school (on six U/M courses).

Value: \$2,500.

CIM - Maintenance Division Bursary for Engineering

Established by the Organizing Committee of the Mine Maintenance Conference, the CIM - Maintenance Division Bursary for Engineering is awarded to a student entering the Engineering program with a good academic record, can demonstrate financial need, and is a resident of Northern Ontario.

Value: \$1,400 Laurentian University Application for Entrance Awards required.

The Ontario Professional Engineers Foundation for Education Entrance Scholarships

Awarded by the Ontario Professional Engineers Foundation for Education, on the recommendation of the University's Faculty of Engineering to well-rounded students entering an accredited engineering program who have a high academic standing and exhibit characteristics of leadership. One scholarship is to be awarded to a male student and the other to a female student.

Value: \$1,250 0/ea

Quantity: 2

The Peter Barott Scholarship

A gift from the friends, colleagues and associates of the late Peter Barott, a Montreal-based architect who designed major projects including the Science I Building at the University and who contributed to an Expo 67 project in collaboration with another architectural firm.

Recipient: A 1st-year student enrolled in the Engineering program, with a min. 75% average in an Ontario secondary school (in six U/M courses). If no student entering Engineering is eligible, the award may be given to a student entering a science program.

Value: \$1,000.

OTHER COMMENTS: Student must not be in receipt of other scholarships or bursaries that exceed a total value of \$1,500.

The Nick Volf Engineering Bursary

Recipient: A full-time 1st-year student of Engineering, and Ontario residency, as defined by OSAP.

Value: \$800

Laurentian University Application for Entrance Awards required.

OTHER COMMENTS: Must demonstrate financial need

INCOURSE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Mason C.F. Kossatz Memorial Scholarship

Established by the family, friends and colleagues of the late Mr. Mason C.F. Kossatz, who passed on in 1989, to commemorate his many contributions to his profession of mining engineering, a career that spanned four decades. Mr. Kossatz had always demonstrated a keen interest in the affairs of the University.

Value: \$3,100 for three years (total of \$9,300).

Recipient: a student (Ontario resident) entering the 2nd year of the Mining Engineering program, based on financial need and academic standing (min. 70% overall average). The scholarship is paid in three installments - in 2nd, 3rd and 4th year of the program - providing the student maintains a min. 70% average. If he or she fails to do so, the remainder of the funds may be awarded to another qualified student. If, in any year, there is no qualified student, the funds will be donated to the library for the purchase of engineering books.

Application for In-Course Awards required.

OTHER COMMENTS: The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Engineering and presented at an annual awards dinner.

The Ontario Professional Engineers Foundation for Education Upper-year Scholarships

Awarded by the Ontario Professional Engineers Foundation for Education, on the recommendation of the University's Faculty of Engineering; to be awarded based on a combination of high academic achievement and demonstrated leadership in professional affairs and extra curricular activities.

Value: \$1000.

The Wallace Family Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Recipient: Awarded annually to a student entering the second year of the School of Engineering or the School of Commerce and Administration. The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic excellence, leadership qualities, and extra-curricular activities, including athletics.

Application for In-Course Awards required.

The R.D. Parker Memorial Scholarship for Women in Mining Engineering

Established by the colleagues, family and friends of the late Ralph D. Parker, who was the chief promoter of the Laurentian University federation and one of the founding governors of the University.

Value: \$900.

Recipient: the female student entering the 3rd or 4th year of the Mining Engineering program with the highest academic standing in the previous year.

The Dr. Janet Springer Memorial Scholarship

Established by the friends and colleagues of Dr. Janet Springer, a senior scientist with the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines who was keenly interested in encouraging young women to pursue non-traditional careers.

Value: \$600.

Recipient: a female student entering 2nd, 3rd or 4th year of a Science or Engineering program, on the basis of academic standing and financial need.

Application for In-Course Awards required.

The Angela Pries-Thabo Nthama Memorial Awards

Value: \$120

Recipient of The Angela Pries Memorial Award: a foreign student entering 2nd, 3rd or 4th year of a program in Engineering, on the basis of academic achievement and demonstrated financial need.

Application for In-Course Awards required.

The J.P. Bickell Foundation Awards

Value: variable.

Recipients: students of Science or Engineering, with a specialization in Geology, or with the intention of specializing in an engineering field related to geology, mining or metallurgy.

Application for In-Course Awards required.

BURSARIES

The Peter Wong Memorial Bursary

Value: \$2,000.

Recipient: a full-time student entering the 3rd year of Engineering who demonstrates financial need, shows leadership qualities and involvement in the City of Greater Sudbury, and is a resident of Ontario as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The Rio Algom Limited Bursaries

Value: \$1,500/ea.

Quantity: 10

Recipients: eight full-time students entering the 2nd, 3rd or 4th year of a Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Extractive Metallurgy or Mining Engineering program, and whose studies involve mining-related environmental rehabilitation; AND, two full-time students from the Serpent River First Nations, who are enrolled in any year of any program. Selection is based on financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The Felix & Maria Lopes Bursary

The "Felix & Maria Lopes Bursary" was established by Lopes Mechanical Limited to honour the life long commitment Felix and Maria have shown to education and the community of Greater Sudbury.

Value: Minimum \$3000

Recipient: This bursary will be awarded to a student in any year of study in the Chemical Engineering program, who can demonstrate financial need, and is a resident of Ontario, as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The Inmet Mining Corporation Bursaries

Value: \$1,100/ea.

Quantity: 2

Recipients: students entering any year of the Mining or Extractive Metallurgy program, on the basis of demonstrated financial need and Ontario residency, as defined by OSAP. **Application required.**

The Sudbury Branch C.I.M.M. Rudolph (Rudy) Kneer Memorial Bursary

Donated by the Sudbury Branch of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy as a memorial to Rudolph (Rudy) Kneer for his dedicated commitment to the Canadian mining industry, particularly in Northern Ontario. He received the Institute's Medal for Distinguished Service in 1979. As founding editor of Northern Ontario Mining News, he combined his love of the newspaper business with his inclination to relate with people in all facets of the industry.

Value: \$1,500

Quantity: 3

Recipients: students entering the 3rd year of the Engineering program, on the basis of financial need, academic standing, demonstrated leadership, and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The School of Engineering Bursary

Value: \$660

Recipient: a full-time student entering any year of an Engineering program, on the basis of financial need and Ontario residency as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The CIBC Wood Gundy/Franklin G.T. Pickard Memorial Awards

Donated by CIBC Wood Gundy Securities Inc., Toronto, Ont. in memory of the late Franklin G.T. Pickard.

Value: variable.

Recipients: full-time students enrolled in the 2nd, 3rd or 4th of a program in Biology, Chemistry or Mining Engineering that involves mining-related environmental rehabilitation. Recipients must submit a short personal profile. Based on academic standing, leadership and extra-curricular activities, Ontario residency and financial need, as defined by OSAP.

Application required.

The James Costigan Memorial Bursary

The endowment was established in memory of James (Jamie) Costigan by family and friends.

Value: \$3,000

Recipient: The "James Costigan Memorial Bursary" is awarded to two students in the Mining Engineering program, who have a strong work ethic, can demonstrate financial need, and are residents of Ontario, as defined by OSAP.

Application is required.

The SGA Capital Campaign Bursaries

Donated by the SGA to the University's Capital Fundraising Campaign (1997), the following bursaries are awarded annually.

Value: \$775.

Quantity: 2

Recipients: students who are SGA members, Ontario residents as defined by OSAP, have financial need, are active in extracurricular activities and meet the other criteria specified below. Students must submit a short statement outlining how they meet criteria.

Application required.

The Ross Boden Engineering Award - other criteria: enrolment in Engineering.

The Amos Dressler Engineering Award - other criteria: enrolment in Engineering

Canadian Institute of Mining Bursary

Established by Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy. The purpose of this award is to provide financial assistance to aid a student of Laurentian University, who is enrolled in the Engineering program. The student must be a member of Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, or the child or legal dependant of a certified member. The student must be in good academic standing as defined by student awards and demonstrate financial need and must be a resident of Ontario, as defined by OSAP. The student must submit a one page minimum essay describing the role the CIM plays in serving the mining industry.

Value: \$1,150 **Application required.**

The Kenneth Sutherland Memorial Bursary

Established in memory of Kenneth Sutherland by family and friends. This bursary will be awarded to a student in the PhD. Program in the Natural Resources Engineering, who can demonstrate financial need, and is a resident of Ontario, as defined by OSAP.

Value: \$580 **Application is required**

The Allan Epps Award

Established to honour the memory of Allan Epps, a dedicated member of the Sudbury mining community. At his time of death, Allan had 36.5 years of service with Inco Ltd., and encouraged his colleagues to "Quit the whining, let's get mining." This award is intended to recognize a deserving student who shares Allan's passion for underground mining and the Sudbury community. The recipient must be enrolled in the Mining Engineering program, must maintain an overall average of 70%, and must demonstrate financial need. The recipient must provide a letter outlining their community involvement or participation in extracurricular activities.

Value: \$500. **Application is required.**
