in Applied Environmental Microbiology***

Laurentian University invites applications for a *tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level within the planned School of the Environment in the area of Applied Environmental Microbiology with a starting date of July 1, 2014*. We seek a highly motivated and innovative individual with excellent records of teaching, research, and publication with strong prospects for securing NSERC funding. Research interests that complement and build upon the goals of our primary environmental research centre (Vale Living with Lakes Centre www.livingwithlakes.ca), and the new Goodman School of Mines (<http://www.laurentian.ca/content/goodman-school-of-mines>) are essential. The successful candidate will be expected to contribute to our BSc, MSc, and PhD programs and assist in our mission to become one of the leading research and educational centres for the protection and management of northern ecosystems, with a particular focus on finding solutions to mining related environmental problems. The successful candidate is expected to contribute to both undergraduate and graduate courses in basic and applied microbiology (e.g. on-line modular course in bioremediation), and the ability to teach introductory courses in genomics and cell biology is desirable. The successful candidate is also expected to be able to teach in both English and French.
