II. LIBR 2000E: The "Killer App": RefWorks 2.0 (Location: Brenda Wallace Computer Room) Class limit: 25

Content: When you are doing a database search RefWorks allows you to quickly save all the references you select – and then incorporate these references into a paper you are writing in a format you choose – APA, MLA, Chicago and more.
