

**P191- Provincial Mine Workers of Ontario fonds**

**Administrative history:** In August 1913, following the 1912-1913 strike at Hollinger mine, in South Porcupine, and the arrest of William Holowatsky, leader of the strike, by the Ontario Provincial Police, a group of miners, lead by A.W. MacInnis worked at establishing the Provincial Mine Workers of Ontario.

**Scope and content:** The fonds consisting of the original draft of the memorandum for the constitution of the Provincial Mine Workers of Ontario, correspondence and copies of decisions on appeals after the arrests of strikers, documents efforts of miners in organizing a provincial union. Moreover, it illustrates the impact the 1912-1913 strike at Hollinger mine, in South Porcupine, had in union recognition.

**Immediate source of acquisition:** donated in 1985 by Dennis Thibault.
