Biographical Sketch: Barbara Dunphy, was a researcher interested in women studies. In 1998 she moved from Toronto to Los Angeles.

Scope and content: Barbara Dunphy fonds consists of audiotaped interviews of wives of miners, from the Kirkland Lake area, and a few accompanying notes on the project. The interviews were done with the intention of producing a film, which did not get off the ground due to funding problems. Among the interviewees are: Myrtle MacLeod, Clara Golden, Kay Carlin, Anna Welyhorsky, Georgina Lebine, Mrs. Allison Mills, Carol Magnusen.
